AGGRAVATED ROBBERY / EVADING ARREST ON FOOT

MONDAY APRIL 22, 2013



On Friday April 19, 2012, at 3:24 pm, San Benito Police Detectives received information regarding a wanted subject traveling in grey four door vehicle by the area of Stenger and Stookey road. When the Police detectives observed the subject inside a parked vehicle they positively identified the subject as 21 year old Jose Luis Calles out of San Benito, and who was wanted on multiple arrest warrants ranging from aggravated robbery to aggravated assault family violence. When the police detectives attempted to make contact with the suspect, he got out of the vehicle, and fled on foot. Police Officers were able to apprehend the suspect a few minutes later, and while searching the suspect a small amount of marijuana was located in his person. Jose Luis Calles is wanted in connection with an aggravated assault as well as burglary habitation that occurred on January 28, 2013 at 9:14 am. In that incident the suspect was accused of breaking into a residence by the 300 block of Centro Street in order to assault his 21 year old girlfriend with an unknown object. During the assault, the female victim sustained injuries to her face as well as lower extremities. Jose Luis Calles is also wanted in connection with an aggravated robbery at the Matt's quick stop located on the 1000 Block of Combes Street that occurred on the evening hours of April 12, 2013 at 10:39 pm. In that incident the clerk stated to Police investigators that a Hispanic male subject wearing a grey shirt, short and covering his face with a blue bandana had walked into the store demanding cash while displaying a screwdriver. The alleged suspect managed to escape before police arrived but Police investigators were able to link Jose Luis Calles to the robbery. Suspect was placed under arrest, and taken to City Jail where he was booked on the following charges: Aggravated robbery-1st Degree Felony, Burglary of Habitation, 1st Degree Felony, Aggravated Assault (family violence)-2nd Degree Felony, evading arrest on foot class A Misdemeanor, and possession of marijuana in a drug free zone class A Misdemeanor. Justice of the Peace Manuel Flores arraigned Mr. Calles and set bonds totaling \$ 65,000. Mr. Calles is currently at the Cameron County jail.
