PRESS RELEASE

ASSAULT A FAMILY VIOLENCE

MONDAY NOVEMBER 5TH, 2012



On Thursday November 1st, 2012, at 12:52 pm, San Benito Police responded to a residence located on the 2100 Block of Yost Street in reference to a domestic disturbance between a male and female. Upon the Police Officers arrival they made contact with a 26 year old female who stated that she had an argument with her boyfriend who she identified as 29 year old Oscar Antonio Gracia out of San Benito. According to the victim during the argument she had injured her left wrist while trying to get her boyfriend off from her. The responding officers noticed broken glass on the floor caused during the disturbance. The victim advised the Officers that the Oscar Gracia had left the residence prior to the Officers arrival. The Police Officers then left the scene, and a few minutes later a police officer observed the alleged male suspect standing outside the residence. The alleged male suspect then ran inside the house, and attempted to hide inside a bedroom closet where he was found by the Police Officers. Oscar Gracia was then taken into custody for a assault class A family violence as well as having \$8,456.80 in fines from Municipal Court. Oscar Gracia was transported to City Jail where he was later arraigned by Municipal Judge David Garza who set bond at \$3,000 Dollars.

On Friday November 2nd, 2012, at 11:20 PM, San Benito Police responded to the 200 Block of South Bowie Street in reference to a domestic disturbance between father and son. Upon the Officers arrival they made contact with a 52 year old male identified as Pedro Salcedo, and his 15 year old son outside their residence. According to the 15 year old his father had hit him on the nose with a closed fist causing for the victim to suffer a bloody nose. The responding Officers noticed clear evidence pointing to an assault, and placed Pedro Salcedo under arrest for Assault A family violence who was then taken to City Jail. Pedro Salcedo was arraigned by Municipal Judge David Garza who set bond at \$ 2,000 Dollars.
